How you can help pets at the new DVIS/Call Rape emergency shelter:

- Free immunizations
- No-cost Spay or Neuter services
- Free flea and tick treatment
- Free surgery
- Answering questions about pet health
- Free or reduced rate for boarding when our kennel is full
- Donate leftover or sample dog/cat food or treats
- Talk about us – give our contact information to a colleague who might like to help
- Host a can food drive at your clinic – ask staff and clients to bring an item for a pet in our kennel
- Being on call for veterinary emergencies

Needed items include:

- Dog food
- Cat food
- Cat litter
- Dog and cat treats
- Leashes and collars
- Cleaning supplies (Laundry detergent, Clorox wipes, bleach, and paper towels)
- Pet dishes
- Clean washcloths, blankets, towels, and dish towels
- Flea & tick medications & collars
- Ear mite wash & medications
- Cat towers
- Litter boxes
- Pet carriers
- Pet beds, blankets
- Water and food bowl
